

Dear store manager,

Ben & Jerry's, the \$1.3-billion subsidiary of Unilever, has made a fortune off its claims of "social responsibility" and "respect for the Earth." The iconic brand also brags that its ice cream is "GMO-free."

But when Organic Consumers Association had an independent lab test 11 samples of Ben & Jerry's ice cream, 10 tested positive for glyphosate (the key ingredient in Monsanto's Roundup weedkiller) or its metabolite, AMPA.

Will you consider removing Ben & Jerry's from your store shelves?

Based on the latest studies linking very low levels of glyphosate to fatty liver disease, cancer tumors, kidney damage and more, one 8-oz. serving of Ben & Jerry's Chocolate Fudge Brownie contains enough glyphosate to give a 75-lb. child 120 percent of the daily dose of glyphosate required to trigger fatty liver disease.

There's nothing "safe" or "socially responsible" about that!

Ben & Jerry's ice cream is often displayed next to organic and locally made ice cream—sometimes priced higher than organic! This misleads consumers into thinking that Ben & Jerry's ice cream is comparable to, or better than, organic.

Glyphosate in its ice cream is only part of Ben & Jerry's toxic #DirtyDairy story.

Vermont taxpayers are stuck with a \$2-billion tab for cleaning up the state's lakes and rivers, polluted by chemical fertilizers and toxic pesticides—glyphosate, atrazine, metolachlor—used to grow the GMO corn that Vermont dairy farmers feed their cows.

Will you consider removing Ben & Jerry's from your store shelves? If not, will you at least move it away from the organic section?
